

**SUBJECT: ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY INSTRUCTION GOALS**

- a) To achieve maximum student advancement in all subjects both academic and special by providing levels of instruction appropriate to the student's ability, and flexibility in programming which will allow a student to be placed in a different group when it is warranted.
- b) To improve lines of communication between the school and the home through increased personal contact and reporting procedures.
- c) To help students develop an appreciation for the intrinsic values of an education through improved methods of teaching, and increased student and parent contacts with the guidance counselors or teachers.
- d) To help each student to develop attitudes and values which will enable him/her to become a worthwhile citizen through the curriculum and appropriate methods of instruction.
- e) To develop attitudes within each student which will encourage him/her to seek out knowledge on his/her own and provide him/her with modern facilities to make this goal attainable.
- f) To develop methods which will enable us to better recognize individual student differences.
- g) To develop a curriculum designed to meet the individual needs of all students.
- h) To constantly re-evaluate the curriculum to see if it is meeting the needs of all students.
- i) To instill in the student a feeling of personal worth.
- j) To provide a program which each student finds meaningful to him/her, thereby increasing his/her chances for success in school.
- k) To help the student understand his/her strengths and weaknesses, and to motivate him/her to overcome his/her weaknesses and exploit his/her strengths.
- l) To help the student explore all the alternative courses of action open to him/her in his/her future.
- m) To develop methods of helping the student recognize the dignity of the individual and to help him/her incorporate in his/her thinking a respect for all humanity.
