

# Approval of Amended Minutes

April 28, 2014

### **Community Voices**

- Several Homer and Truxton community members, parents, tax payers and business owners spoke both in favor of the transformation of Hartnett Elementary to a New Tech High School as well as opposed. Individuals offered various reasons why to change or not to change and left Board members with insight to consider in making their determination.

May 13, 2014

### **Community Voices**

- There were seven speakers from Truxton who voiced concerns on the proposed idea of converting Hartnett Elementary to a New Tech High School. **Truxton community members turned in a petition with 479 signatures.**

May 27, 2014

### **Community Voices**

- Several Truxton community members continued to voice their concerns on the proposed idea of converting Hartnett Elementary to a New Tech High School.
- Ms. Austen inquired about current P.E. requirements at Hartnett Elementary.

June 10, 2014

### **Community Voices**

- Several community members spoke on the future of Truxton Elementary and a New Tech High School. **Truxton community members turned in petition signed by 79 people with the majority of signatures being young children.**

June 24, 2014

### **Community Voices**

- Members from the Truxton community reiterated their **concerns** on transforming Hartnett Elementary to a New Tech High School.

July 8, 2014

### **Community Voices**

- Members from the Truxton community continued their dialogue reiterating their views on transforming Hartnett Elementary to a New Tech High School.

July 22, 2014

### **Community Voices**

- A group of Homer community members spoke to the Board on behalf of their support for the New Tech School being housed at Hartnett Elementary. A petition of support with over 400 signatures from the Homer community was provided to the Board in support of the project.
- There were also Truxton community members present stating they support the New Tech idea, just not the location of it at Hartnett Elementary, **as they believe Hartnett K-6 should remain an elementary school.**
