Cortland County Youth Leadership Program (CCYL)

Students from schools all across Cortland County attended problem solving techniques at CRMC. They examined microbiology and blood work in the hospital's laboratory, considered the importance of hospital cleanliness in the lobby, how much sugar goes into everyday drinks in the cafeteria and how to work through physical therapy session. The program has been around since 2004, funded by the Cortland Youth Bureau and the Slegle Foundation, and is modeled on Cortland Chamber of Commerce's Leadership Cortland program. The students meet at different Cortland locations each month to learn about how different part of Cortland works. Civil Engineering and Architecture Presentation

Former Homer High School Student, Alys West, talked to the Civil Engineering and Architecture Class on December 20th. Ms. West presented her design of a home for the physically and mentally challenged that she helped design. What is unique about Ms. West's design is that the home will be built in the Ukraine and is a first of its kind. She presented to the CEA class the problems she encountered from not only an Architectural and Structural perspective (for example: use of concrete for everything structural), but to the culture as well (where students learned that in the Ukraine the mentally challenged are usually left in one home their entire life). The first home to be built will be a home for males 18 years old and older. The home will incorporate many of the ADA standards we use in the United States (the Ukraine has no such standards). The home will give the men a chance for the freedom that they do not have at the moment. A home for females will follow when this project is complete. Students in the CEA class were honored to learn from an ex student and were surprised to see how other parts of the world may not have the same thoughtful building codes that we have here in the United States. It also gave the students a view of other careers that may be out there. The students shared email addresses with Ms. West so they can continue to see the progress of this project.
